

## HAVING TROUBLE GETTING EMAILS FROM GVA? TRY THESE POSSIBLE FIXES...

GVA uses an email marketing platform called MailChimp to send out weekly reminders about our activities and periodically send out a special email about an art opportunity you might have missed. Sometimes people have difficulty getting these communications. Here are a few common delivery issues that can affect MailChimp delivery:

- The email is still in transit. The time it takes to receive the activation email can vary. Depending on internet traffic and how busy your ISP is, it can take some time for emails to arrive. This is particularly true for AOL, Yahoo, and Gmail accounts. Some webmail programs delay delivery of bulk mail to your inbox by up to 24 hours.
- GVA's email is in a spam folder. Check your junk or spam folder to see if the activation email arrived there. If you use Gmail check to make sure that GVA emails are not getting sent to your "promotions" or "social" box. If this happens, please add Gvartists@gmail.com to your contacts list to ensure that future emails from us are placed in your Primary tab.
- If you use a corporate email server, there could be an issue with your company's filter, firewall, or server. Test your forms with an external test account like Yahoo, Hotmail, Gmail, etc. If you get the confirmation email at those accounts as expected, it may be a corporate email server problem. Please check with your server administrator to make sure that emails from @mailchimp.com addresses aren't being blocked.
- Your email could be caught in an aggressive spam filter. Ask the subscriber to check the junk folder.
- If you suspect there may have been a typo in your signup email address, please send a message to danabdonnell@gmail.com to verify the correct address for MailChimp communications from GVA.



Bill Christiansen's medium is photography and his brush is a Nikon camera. His subject could be the Mackinac Bridge, a bear in Alaska, a rickhouse in Kentucky, or even guitars captured in the wilds of the Heritage factory. We travel by car when we venture out, allowing many opportunities to pull over when we find something captivating for Bill to photograph. Car travel is best for this because those pictures taken from an airplane window never seem to turn out. My brush is an iPhone from which I navigate and document our travels. My palette is the Google Map app.

On our most recent trip driving back from Bar Harbor, Maine, the subject of covered bridges came up as a fall color photo subject. (Note: the Fallasburg Covered Bridge in Lowell has been one that Bill has wanted to capture in fall, but hasn't because we are usually traveling out of state.) I opened my Google map app and typed "covered bridge" in the search bar. Google found them all around us and many were very close to our route. We began seeking out these scenic, often historic covered bridges. Most had virtually no traffic, allowing Bill to take his time setting up the shot. We stopped at covered bridges across Maine, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, and New York.

As we crossed the border from Pennsylvania to Ohio along I-90 West, we entered Ashtabula County, destined for our first Ohio covered bridge. Imagine our surprise as we pulled up to find a tent pitched beside the bridge with the local Fire Department roasting hot dogs. At first I thought maybe it was a private picnic, but Bill approached the tent to ask what was going on. Turns out that weekend was the ASHTABULA COUNTY COVERED BRIDGES FESTIVAL! This particular covered bridge was one of 19 covered bridges highlighted by the festival and maps were available. Bill got all the covered bridge photography he could handle that day, and we laughed about our luck and timing.

When we returned to Michigan, Bill did venture up to Fallasburg to capture our beautiful local covered bridge with the fall color he wanted. Bill's new Covered Bridge Collection is now on display at the Biggby Coffee shop at 146 Monroe Center St NW # 155, Grand Rapids, MI 49503.

### Remembering JIM MARKLE

One of my first duties at GVA was to write an article about Jim Markle. I had seen his work before and was very interested to find out more about him. Like many others who had the pleasure of meeting Jim, I was at first in awe, then was quickly put at ease by his gentle and warm manner. Here's an edited version of what I first wrote about this remarkable man and his lasting impression on our organization and its members.

There's an old saying by Thomas Edison: "Genius is one percent inspiration and ninety-nine percent perspiration." He must have been talking about Jim Markle.

Jim retired in 1994 after a long career in the publishing business. As much success as he'd had

Why do I love painting landscapes? I think it's mostly the multitude of images that nature creates through a combination of light striking objects and the wonderful images that can result to experience and paint. That combination can change an image fast that sometimes the image is just a fleeting memory.

This exhibit records my impressions of those moments I've experienced while searching for scenes that spoke to me. Some are paintings done in plein air and some are studio paintings that were done from sketches or impressions of moments I've experienced while traveling. All are views of my impression of moments I wanted to record.





up to that point, he had always wanted to spend more time on his art, so at the age most people start to slow down, Jim picked up the pace and eventually became one of the finest pastel artists in the U.S. After his retirement (and lots of hard work), Jim began exhibiting nationally in such locations as New Mexico, L.A., New Orleans, and New York as well as in Canada and Europe. Jim got the attention of several major art magazines, such as the Pastel Artist International. He earned awards from places as far away as Europe as well as locally here in Grand Rapids.

Jim became a Signature Member of the Pastel Society of America in 1999 and Master Member of the Great Lakes Plein Air Painters Association in 2004. He served as the president of Grand Valley Artists and of the Great Lakes Pastel Society. He also invented the Jim Markle Pastel Easel Box designed specifically for plein air painting and tested in Europe by Jim himself. Now that's the way to spend retirement!

When Jim and a group of distinguished local area artists exhibited at the Muskegon Museum of Art, they were promptly named the "West Michigan Eight." Rounding out this group were Carl Forsland, Collin Fry, Larry Blovits, Jon McDonald, Chris Stoffel Overvoorde, Jack Brouwer, and Armond Merizon.

Jim held workshops in pastels not only at GVA, but at other galleries in Michigan and beyond. A humble man, Jim always encouraged others to become their best and always juggled compliments with advice at our monthly critiques.

Jim's legacy lives on in the many of us who benefited from his remarkable example.

The stunning images generated unprecedented reader interest as a National Geographic magazine cover story and as the best-selling book about Jim's career. Emmy nominated, *Chased by the Light*, documentary has won over 15 international awards.
