Where: Celia Said's cottage at 7206 Lifeguard Rd, Montague, Mi, 49437



Why: To have fun, enjoy Lake Michigan, maybe draw, paint, or take photos and get to know more members of GVA.

Directions to the cottage:

Take 31 towards Ludington. Use Whitehall/Montague exit. Turn right & go straight thru town, down the hill, over the causeway, & up the hill on Dowling St. (We will have GVA signs at all of the turns from here on.) Turn left onto Launos. Turn left onto Lau Road towards Medbury Park and the Channel. Go over the bridge. Take 1st 2-track after the bridge. Stay right at the forks in the two track. If you prefer to follow the lake shore you can take an altenate route which is: turn left at the beginning of Dowling and follow the lake around on the Old Channel Trail, eventually turning left onto Lau Rd. It takes about an hour from the GVA gallery.

Bring your camera and/or art supplies.

We are the 6th house north of the pier, channel, and lighthous, so you can walk or drive to paint the White River Lighthouse which is across the channel. You could set up an easel on the pier and paint people, boats, landscape, or the lighthouse, or just take pictures for reference. If it rains, some people could paint from my studio or from the balcony of my studio overlooking Lake Michigan.

Bob Kraai spent months planning for our annual Reeds Lake Art Festival. May/June arrived and Steve started to line up promotions for the Festival. This year, interviews with Steve were scheduled on both Fox TV and Eight West. In addition, he was interviewed by Shelly Irwin at Grand Valley State University's radio station.

I volunteered to help Steve transport some examples of our Reeds Lake artists' work from interview to interview as Steve wanted to make certain we displayed different work at each of the media events.

I would imagine the artists were delighted to see their art promoted on television. Watching and listening to Steve being interviewed on TV was a great experience. After arriving at the stations, preparation was chaotic. Trying to find the entrance to the studio, loading artwork on a cart, hurriedly being escorted to the TV studio, frantically try-



ing to set up a small display of artwork within a short period of time...it can leave you breathless! But when Steve was in front of the camera, he appeared relaxed and was totally engaging.

Steve's background makes him a perfect fit for his position as GVA Chair of Publicity. In the '70s, Steve worked in publicity. 



Dominican Center at Marywood





CALL FOR ARTISTS Grand Valley Artists Juried Exhibition at the Box Factory for the Arts

Located in beautiful St. Joseph, close to the bustling downtown business district and the shore of Lake Michigan, The Box Factory for the Arts will host a juried exhibit of the work of Grand Valley Artists in their Williams Gallery, September 6 through October 12, 2019.

Our juror will be Kristin Hosbein, a St. Joseph-based plein air and studio painter, known throughout Michigan and beyond for her beautiful land-scapes and harbor scenes.



The following guidelines have been established for this exhibit:

- This exhibit will be limited to approximately 50 works. All types of art and mediums are welcome.
- The Box is a community, family friendly gallery. While nude images are allowed, do not submit sexually provocative images.
- 3D work including sculptures is permitted; large works (more than 60" or 100lbs) need prior approval before submission. Check with Doug Klemm (616) 481-6121.
- The Box will take 30% commission on art sales. All work must remain in the show until conclusion.
- The Box reserves the right to use the galleries during the GVA Exhibit. It is possible that some work may be temporarily moved.
- GVA and Box volunteers will hang the exhibit with oversight of Nikki Gauthier, Curator.
- The Opening Reception will be hosted by The Box.
- Awards: 1st Place \$300; 2nd Place \$200; 3rd Place \$150 and 4th Place \$100 will be selected by the juror and awarded at the opening reception.

APPLYING & SUBMITTING YOUR WORK

Submissions open July 1, 2019 and close July 19, 2019. (No late entries will be accepted.)

Next, list your entries, numbering as follows:

- Entry 1: Title of Work
- Medium
- Size
- Price \$\$\$ or NFS
- Repeat for Entries 2 and 3.
- Attach a photo of each entry.
- Your cost of entry is \$20 for one entry. Add \$5 for each additional entry.
- Entries will not be considered complete until payment is received.

PRESENTATION OF WORK

It is to your advantage to submit clear crisp images of properly photographed work. Do not shoot your images through glass! Remove artwork from the frame before photographing. It is also best to crop the images so that only the art and not the matte or frame is photographed.

- Work must be wired for hanging. Sawtooth hangers are not permitted.
- Submit original art. No giclees or other reproductions of your art will be allowed.
- Framing must show good craftsmanship.
- No exposed glass edges
- Entries will be handled with care. However, neither GVA nor The Box Factory for the Arts, or staff or members of either is responsible for loss or damage to an artist's work.
- Selected images must remain for the duration of the show.
- Please do not submit work that was previously shown in an exhibit at The Box.

- GVA WILL TRANSPORT artwork back to GVA Studio on Monday, October 14.
- Pick-up Artwork after October 14 from GVA Studio.
