
Diane, Bob, and DeLaine have shared some of the portraits they have done while following the weekly "Portrait Artist of the Week" challenge.


Jeremy Kuhn has shared sketches he has done while watching gestures on YouTube. <u>Here</u> is a great YouTube model session to get you started:



Scones!

I have been making these scones for about three month now. When I was painting with my friends at GVA, I'd started to take a batch almost every time! When COVID-19 arrived, my scone habit didn't go away, so now I make them for myself and take some to my neighbors. The secret to good scones is to keep the dough as cold as possible, so I work fast and get them into the oven while the butter within is still cold.

In a large bowl, mix
2 C flour
1/2 C sugar
2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
dash salt

Then blend in 1 stick of <u>cold</u> butter. I use salted butter. If you use unsalted, increase the salt to ½ teaspoon.

Then add 1/2 C heavy cream or Half & Half 1 egg 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla

Add any special ingredients, like raisins, craisins, chocolate chips, chopped nuts if you want. Or you can make more savory scones by leaving the vanilla and the sugar OUT and putting shredded cheese or whatever in them instead.

Blend <u>thoroughly</u> with the pastry blender. (I got an awesome pastry blender on Amazon!)

Drop heaping tablespoons of blended dough patted together onto a cookie sheet about 2" apart. The recipe makes about 16 scones this way, so you'll need 2 cookie sheets.

I like to dip the tops into fancy large sugar crystals before baking, or you can frost them with powdered sugar/milk frosting when they cool instead if you prefer. Or neither.

Bake at 375° for about 15 minutes. The actual recipe says longer and hotter (400°F), but my oven must be hot and fast! The bottoms will be slightly browned. Be vigilant, because they can burn quickly if you leave them in too long.





Grasping at straws, the editor allows a recipe into the newsletter. Tough times call for tough measures!
