If you haven't checked out our GVA venue profile on the ArtPrize site as written by Marty Klar, this is what it says:

Lots of artists think big for ArtPrize<sup>®</sup>, so Grand Valley Artists (GVA) has decided to go big by "Thinking Small"! Imagine the impact and media buzz a huge assemblage of small artworks will generate. We'll be filling our 1600 sq. ft. gallery with artworks that each fit into a 16"x20" black frame. What's more, the working studio of GVA will be in full swing during ArtPrize with ongoing live portrait sessions and still life sessions for our members. The opportunity to see artists at work in one room and finished art in our gallery makes the GVA venue a truly unique 'art infused' experience for visitors. To attract even more art lovers, GVA will expand their hours beyond those required by ArtPrize. Consider too that because GVA is the lone sponsor of the annual Reeds Lake Art Festival thousands of art enthusiasts will be learning about our Art Prize venue this June. Among our over 200 members are many locally and nationally lauded artists. Join us as we celebrate our 60th year of creating and sharing art in the community. GVA's professionally lit studio is well suited to feature small scale 3D art works as well. Come hang with us. You'll be in great company as we make 'small' news!



Carol Laurn and I met with some of the ArtPrize® committee people and we discussed how GVA could successfully compete with the big installation venues. They indicated that it would be fun if we did a smaller works exhibit since it would be

different than most of the other venues and would suit our space. In our first ArtPrize meeting at GVA, we spent a good deal of time discussing a size most of our members would be comfortable working in as well as allowing us to enable as many artworks as possible to be displayed in our gallery without overcrowding. It was decided that an image that fits within a standard 16" x 20" frame (or smaller) would be a good size. We're also asking that the frames be black so we can present a cohesive viewing experience in the gallery.

Another way we are looking to build enthusiasm and to bring attention to our organization is hold our regular sketch sessions; model, still life, plein air and portrait groups during the hours we're open during ArtPrize. (cont.)

And we're considering repainting the interior of the studio in a lighter color. We'll be hosting a paint-the-studio weekend in the near future. We hope you will get out your paint clothes and join us. Date to be decided. Various committees will be needed so please sign up to help us look our best for the ArtPrize public. I look forward to seeing the wonderful work I know that you all create.





# Pamela DeTuncq=Venturesome, Fearless, Bold, Dauntless, Brave...

There is a country song titled "I Have A Girl Crush" sung by a female vocalist. I too have a "Girl Crush" after listening to Pamela De Tuncq's presentation at Grand Valley Artist's Program night, April 13, 2017. Actually presentation is the wrong noun to use here. A more appropriate noun is conversation. The atmosphere she created was of one of girls [with Randy and Joe] sitting around a table sharing private life experiences as we move through this crazy unpredictable world. As Pamela's range of slides featured her early ceramic works and progressed to her installations, we learned about her private thoughts as well as her artistic journey throughout the years.



Pamela begins with a theme. Universal themes such as teen alienation, gender stereotypes, aging, and the ephemeral nature of existence have been issues she has explored. When she has selected a theme she will consider any and all mediums to develop that theme.

Now, this is when we learned Pamela is a risk taker. When she decided to talk about teen alienation, she chose wool to build her figures. As she had no experience with any wool-related medium, she traveled to meet sheep farmers and learned about wool. The humorous stories Pamela shared as she learned about a new medium and the struggles inherent in exploring a new medium were at times interesting as well as humorous.



Another universal theme was the unbelievable amount of pills her mother had to take following heart surgery. She visited a manufacturer who worked with plastic substances and learned about the use of plastic. She made a life size mold of an elderly woman and took this mold to a manufacturer to build a plastic figure. Pamela filled this life-sized clear plastic figure with pills. One of our members asked Pamela the cost of this undertaking. She stated an enormous amount but said she *had* to make this sculpture and paid for it with her own money. This cost was the reason she was driving a car with 200,000 miles on it.

As an aside, Joanne Swann asked Pamela to talk to our artists. Joanne met Pamela when she worked in graphic design in Long Beach California. They have maintained a 35 year friendship. A large thank you to Joanne for asking Pamela to share with us. What a great experience!!!

Note: Artists who come to multiple days will have priority in seating. If you do not come to the first day, please allow other artists to set up first.


