

The pursuit of excellence

For me, and for every artist, it's important to establish standards of excellence. It's not enough to just be creative, you need to develop high level skills. If you want to improve your work, you need to master all the basic drawing and design fundamentals. Just take a piece of paper and divide it into two columns heading the left side with "these are the things that I have mastered", and head the right side with "these are the things that I have not mastered". Then start with words like: light, volume, color, aerial perspective, geometric perspective, proportion, balance, and anything that you're weak in, and truthfully place them in the appropriate right or left or right column. Whatever ends up in the right column is what you need to learn and master. Go to your bookshelf or the art section in the library and pull out an arm full of books. Open the index of the first book to the first word in the right column and only read the pages indicated. Copy down in your notebook in in a section for that word any pertinent information you find. Close the book without looking at the rest of it and open the next book to the index and repeat the process. Go through all the books following this procedure, and when done, go get another armload and continue looking up that one word.

Now, with all that information written down in your notebook, go back to your artwork and see if you can apply the first notation. Then the second notation and so on. Continue to practice that one word fundamental until you have mastered it, no matter how long it takes. If there is still some gray area in your understanding of the fundamental, continue your research as stated above. When you have mastered that fundamental, and it is very evident in your artwork, move that word to the left column, and start the whole process over with the second word in the right hand column. Continue working on mastering all the words that you put down in the right hand column.

As a result, your facility will excel, and you will become a better artist. Whenever your artwork calls for the use of a fundamental, like light that you have mastered, you can use it with great power and impact.

Whatever you can't do, learn how to do it, and build your competence. All it takes is practice, practice, practice!

GVA Juried Art Competition at Inner City Christian Federation

We hope GVA members will take advantage of this opportunity to display your art work outside of our GVA facility. Chris Stoffel Overvoorde, professor of Art Emeritus at Calvin College, has invited GVA artists to show their work at the Inner City Christian Federation located at 920 Cherry Street in Grand Rapids. This gorgeous building, renovated in 2008, will be a great location to display your work. Chris has graciously offered to give us a reception [this means no baking ladies] and a planned program in honor of this occasion. The program, which is scheduled for January 8, 2015, will include presentation of awards.

The following information includes instructions for this competition:

Art work for the ICCF will be juried at the GVA building on Tuesday, November 18. Jurors will include Joel Zwart and Chris Stoffel Overvoorde. You can drop your work off in the GVA gallery either Thursday evening, November 13 during sketch from 7pm to 9pm or Saturday, November 15 during sketch from 10am to 1pm. Kathy Bechtel and Carol Laurn will be there to greet and assist you, take your entry form, and entry fee. The registration fee is \$10 for one entry and \$15 for two entries. Make check payable to Grand Valley Artists, Inc.

Each member may submit one or two works to be juried. Work should be no larger than 35". Art work must "look" professionally framed. No giclees or commercial reproductions. Work must be sturdily wired and ready to hang.

The work juried into the show will be transported to ICCF. You will be notified by email whether or not your work is included. Bring a stamped, self-addressed envelope if we cannot contact you by email. The date of installation is November 20. The show is on display from November 24 to February 6. Non selected art work may be picked up as soon as possible at GVA at any time our facility is open. Please consult the activities calendar in our newsletter.

Selected art work may be picked up after February 6. Should our "mature members" feel uncomfortable about retrieving their work from ICCF please contact either Kathy Bechtel or Carol Laurn.

Sales will be the responsibility of the artist. Prices will be available at the front desk including contact information. ICCF will need the value of each piece for insurance purposes. ICCF is leaving its percentage of a sale according to the wishes of the artist. Inserted into this newsletter is a form which must be completed and attached to the work when left at GVA to be juried.
