





## The Box Factory: The Juror's Comments

First of all, I'd like to thank Doug Klemm and the Grand Valley Artists for allowing me to jury this show. It's a great honor for me to be allowed to judge these fine artist's work, and not one I take lightly. Each work is unique and shows the vision and skill of the hand of the artist. One can see that there is a mix of many mediums and varying levels of experience in the work shown here in the Williams Gallery, from portraits to still life, landscapes to abstract in a variety of mediums, including digital. In jurying what was to be included, I had to determine that we had enough wall space to show them all, and was a tight fit!

Judging the awards was a fun and interesting process... After spending time soaking up these works of art, I decided that there were several parameters that might be a good way to judge the choices:

1. Judging art is subjective: there is no one way to say one work is better than another, because there are SO many ways to look at art. I spent plenty of time looking at each piece, and seriously found that they all deserve an award, because it takes a bit of courage to put the work of your hands and mind on a wall for others to judge.

2. I simplified the parameters for the awards that will be handed out. I chose to judge the art based upon the following:a. The artist's vision: what does the title say about what they wanted to communicate with the viewer? Does it all seem to align?b. Was the final work a clean and concise way to illustrate that vision? Sometimes we see that artists labor for days and weeks over their work. Sometimes this labor doesn't make the work any better than if it had been done quickly. I didn't want to make an award simply because a work was bigger, or clearly took a lot of time, even though I really love those works as well.

c. Technical skill. Is the artist proficient in the medium that they used? Is the composition good? Does the work invite you in to look at it more?

So with those parameters in mind, I chose the following:

1st place: Jim Johnson's "Happily Married Man": For one thing, Jim is a technically amazing artist. We haven't met before, but one can tell he is confident in his art by the gestural style and easy color of his watercolors. He highlighted the figure with a lighter wash of color behind him, and yet maintained the wallpaper patterned background in a fluid way. I had to laugh when I read the title, because the beer can on the floor stands out in a noticeable way. Beer in this case makes for a happily married man! It's a well-done portrait executed delightfully.

2nd: Joel Goeldel: "Sometimes I See Things": This work combines the artist's imagination with an ordinary object, a lion's profile popping out of a piece of driftwood. Very simply done, and clearly and precisely executed. Again, it makes us smile, and is done very simply and clearly. Well done.

3: Marty Klar: "Pathway": Of all of the oil paintings in this show, all of which are done well, this one caught my eye because of the simplicity. Our eye is led down the path, and the oil paint is juicy thick, some is glossy, some is matt, and I'm presuming it is painted on paper because it is also matted and behind glass. I found it intriguing, because we can feel the cloudy day and the wind in the trees just by the application of color and texture. Nice.

4. Steve Scarborough: "Circle of Fear": This is a small photograph in the back corner of the room. The design intrigued me from the beginning. The star in the middle, which resembles an early American pinwheel. But on closer inspection, it is a ride at a fair, with dozens of feet hanging off the edges. Once we look closer we realize what we are looking at, and all at once the title makes perfect sense! Well done! I'd love to see this printed very large, so that it makes a bigger impact, but it's a powerful image even in this small size.

Congratulations to all of you award winners and to all of the artists exhibiting tonight. It's a great show, and I hope that you continue to create your art!
