My friend has some gourds. What can be done with them?

Since it's harvest season, October 13th, Program Night, seems like a good time to introduce some "out of the box" ideas using gourds as a fine art form.

Gourds have been around for centuries. They are grown all over the world in many types, sizes, and shapes. Archaeological sites world-over have uncovered tools, musical instruments, kitchen utensils and objects of art, all made from gourds.

Today, many gourd art enthusiasts are organizing and joining groups to share and promote activities relating to gourds. The American Gourd Society is one of the largest organized groups with membership throughout the world. The Michigan Chapter has just hosted its Annual Herb and Gourd Festival here in Grand Rapids. The Festival included examples of painting, chip carving, wood burning, filigree work, coiling and weaving. All techniques were done using the gourd as a substrate.

So to answer the question above: I would say, "You'd be surprised, at what is done with gourds."

In China, artists have developed a way to grow gourds in a splitmold. Once grown, the gourd is removed from the mold, hollowed out, cleaned, dyed and polished. In this photo, piece of jade is rounded and smoothed to serve as a top.

- provide more hands-on workshops
- continue to have critiques to share our work with other artists but also offer a more advanced/technical critique for our more advanced artists


