

For a second meeting in September on the 18th we had an interesting workshop where Jim Henningson brought a Stroboscopic Light, an electronic strobe with a continuous repeating flash and controllable output. Mike Mitchell brought an MIOPS Splash. The unit is controlled via Bluetooth to an app on a smart phone or tablet. It will control up to four water drops and eliminates the need for an eye dropper. (Bill Andrus shared some photos with us here.) Our first October meeting is scheduled for the October 2. Join us!
